***Good Morning Arizona* Plans to Visit Navajo Nation a Second Time!**

Window Rock, AZ – On May 5th at Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, Utah, the Navajo Nation will be getting a second visit from the *Good Morning Arizona* – Road Trip crew and once again residents from all over the Navajo Nation are invited to come out and be a part of the show starting at 6 a.m.

Last year, May 7, 2007 the popular anchor team, which includes Dan Davis, Tara Hitchcock, Brad Perry, Scott Pasmore, and Oliva Fierro, visited Window Rock and set up video production, *live* from the Navajo Nation Museum. On that day Navajo Nation President Joe Shirley with First Lady Vikki Shirley attended and gave a formal greeting to the anchor team. Also former Miss Navajo Nation Joycelyn Billy was present and did a demonstration on how to make blue corn mush. Other special guests included renowned storyteller Sunny Dooley, who explained to statewide viewers the symbolism behind the Navajo Hogan and the Navajo cradleboard.



For this year, *Good Morning Arizona* will be filmed in a special digital television broadcasting system, commonly used for high definition television (HDTV). KTVK-

Chan3 decided to shoot *Good Morning Arizona – Road Trip* at Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park because of the panoramic scenery it unfailingly offers time and time again.



Residents of each road trip location are encouraged to come out and be part of the live show from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. The *Good Morning Arizona – Road Trip* personalities will autograph souvenir postcards, and the first 200 people to show up on location will receive a special souvenir road trip bandanna.
